MOVE UPS

Move-ups to all classes **other than into Master** will be accepted provided the request is made to the Trial Secretary no later than Monday, June 1, 2026, 5:00 pm for the Saturday of the trial. Move-up requests may be sent in writing or e-mailed to the Trial Secretary. The e-mail move up will not be official unless acknowledged by the secretary.

Move-ups from Excellent to Master will only be accepted, subject to the above, and if the move-up does not cause judging hours to be exceeded. This includes any excellent titles earned after the random draw, titles earned Saturday, June 6, or move-up requests as a result of an incorrect entry form. **No refund will be issued if you cannot move up because of trial limits.**

For Titles earned during this trial, a move up form must be delivered to the Trial Secretary within 30 minutes of the conclusion of judging of the class they are moving up from for the subsequent days. Dogs so moved will be entered at the end of the running order.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION

PPAC is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of 50 entries per day will be placed on the club's wait list. All entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to May 20, 2026, 5:00 pm MT. No entries may be withdrawn with a refund after closing on May 20, 5:00 pm.

Any waitlisted entry that does not move off the wait list and into the trial on May 20 @ 5 pm will receive a full refund.

Entries must reach the Trial Secretary by May 20, 2026, 5:00 p.m. (MT). Fees must accompany all entries. Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate and legible information on their entry forms. Postdated checks and returned checks will invalidate an entry with a \$30.00 Service Fee charged for returned checks. Entry fees will not be refunded if a dog or handler is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee. Telephoned & unsigned entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on official AKC Entry Forms or photocopies of entry forms without the Agreement and Rules are not acceptable. No entry shall be made and no entry accepted, which specifies any conditions for its acceptance. **Neither the Club nor the Trial Secretary are responsible for legibility/accuracy of contact information provided on completed forms, technical difficulties in electronic communications or postal delays. It is therefore recommended that handlers email the Trial Secretary 7-10 days from mailing their entry to confirm entry receipt if acknowledgement has not been received.**

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include the warm-up, check-in table and posting of running order and results.

Crating will be solely in or around private vehicles in the designated parking areas. There is not room for RVs or trailers. No overnight camping. Weighted canopies no larger than 10' x 10'

are permitted if they do not block flow of traffic or prevent another vehicle from exiting. For safety reasons, **XPens are NOT allowed.**

The **Handlers' Briefing** will take place in view of each search area prior to the start of each class, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handlers' Briefing, the judge will explain if there is an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. **NO DOGS** are to be present during the Handlers' Briefing. The club shall designate a warm-up area. One labelled container per target odor being used in the trial on that day will be placed in the warm-up area. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Each team should limit their warm-up to two minutes or less so that others may be able to use the warm-up area as well. Clubs may also place blank containers.

DOG ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete.

Condition of the Dog. Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, they display no signs of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Dogs with bandages, sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf dogs and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Dogs that are both deaf and blind can participate so long as the handler is in control of the dog at all times, the dog can complete the requirements of the class, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

GUARANTEED WORKER SLOTS

Pikes Peak Agility Club is offering guaranteed worker entries for selected positions. A maximum of 15% of the trial entry limit will be reserved for Key Committee and Core Volunteer roles on a graduated scale, with volunteer club members taking precedence. Contact the Volunteer Coordinator with your interest.

SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class. **Search Area Conditions.** Searches may be indoors, on matted, carpeted, dirt, or tiled surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces. *For this trial, only containers and interior will be inside; Buried will be on concrete.* **Search Area Sizes** will be as required in the *Regulations for AKC Scent Work.*

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Facility Terrain: PLEASE READ – This facility consists of several buildings and search areas over more than 1 acre. Although the Committee has created efficiencies between paired courses Exhibitors should anticipate walking to certain areas over paved, dirt, gravel, and other non-flat, sloped surfaces from the parking area to the individual searches. Some interior searches will require navigating a short run of stairs. Reasonable accommodation for those with Handicapped Parking Permits will be made. Please contact the Trial Chair for additional information on parking prior to starting each day. Toilet facilities will be a Porta Potty adjacent to the parking area.

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments, and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5. Section 35 of the Scent Work Regulations state “No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area.”

Spectator Area. Spectators are encouraged. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds. To prevent line of sight violations, a **designated potty area** will be indicated. **Handlers found beyond posted signs, even accidentally, may be subject to excusal from that day’s trial.**

No food will be provided on site so competitors should come prepared with their own snacks, beverages, and lunch. There are restaurants in Elizabeth, CO, approximately 5 miles from the trial site.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The American Kennel Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The American Kennel Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the American Kennel Club or any official thereof.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may be used when handlers are relieving their dogs away from the buildings and other dogs. Leash must be at shortest practical length and locked in transit. Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to ensure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.

If an entered dog becomes injured or sick after the closing date, a 50% refund of that dog's entry fee is offered. The refund will be in the form of voucher to be used at a future PPAC Scent work trial. The trial secretary must be notified by writing/e-mail, by 5:00pm the day before the 1st day of the weekend trials. i.e., Friday at 5:00pm for a 2-day trial that is Saturday & Sunday. A letter from a Vet must be provided to the trial secretary no later than 3 business days after the last day of the weekend trials.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

RINGSIDE

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required. *Dogs will be judged in gate order, adjusting for conflicts or as otherwise described herein.*

Exhibitors MUST check in EACH day they are entered.

From the south/Colorado Springs: Take 1-25 to County Line Rd, 14 miles. Turn right on County Line Rd. Drive 5 miles to CO-83. Turn left onto CO-83. Drive 10 miles to Russellville Rd. Turn right on Russellville Rd. Drive 7.8 miles to Deerfield Rd. Turn right on Deerfield Rd. Drive 2 miles to CO-86. Turn right onto CO-86. Drive 6 miles to CO-21. Turn left onto CO-21. Drive approximately 2 miles to CR 146. **Turn right onto CR 146.** Destination will be on the left.

From the north: With Tolls – I-25 South to exit 194. Take E-470 towards Limon. Go 5.5 miles to exit 5, CO 83S/S Parker Road. Go 4 miles to Hess Rd. Turn left onto Hess Rd. Hess Rd becomes Hilltop Rd.
